4. More Inspirations for Your BIG IDEAS Project



Kerrisdale Grade 6/7 students explored the relationship amongst art, audience, location and politics. Taking the approach of art criticism and researching the roles of government and citizenry in creating cities and public spaces, the students were challenged to create a multimedia presentation reflecting and communicating the changes they want to see in the world.

Cypress Park Grade 3 students learned about who they are and deepened their understanding of their own distinct uniqueness. They inquired into the nature of self; beliefs and values; personal, physical, mental, social and spiritual health; human relationships; different cultures; rights and responsibilities; and what it means to be human. They also inquired into how they can use their strengths and abilities in their families, relationships, and communities.
