The **Vancouver Biennale BIG IDEAS Education Program** uses art as a catalyst to foster cross-curricular, creative expression, transformative thinking, and social responsibility. Drawing inspiration from the Vancouver Biennale international art exhibition, the BIG IDEAS program creates open, inclusive, innovative and impactful learning opportunities. Since 2010, 4,200 students across seven BC school districts have participated in our award-winning program.

2014 Cross-Curricular Challenge

Based on the 2014-2015 exhibition theme: *Open Borders Crossroads Vancouver*, teachers are invited to create their own projects or get involved with colleagues to develop bigger, collaborative projects to engage students in cross-curricular, inquiry-based learning. Explore our online learning resources for project ideas on a diverse range of topics such as ecosystems, cultural diversity, mathematical applications or emotional wellness with links to all curriculum areas. Draw from curriculum unit plans and learning cases from past projects to create your own project for any grade. Our online curriculum unit plans support the proposed *'Transforming B.C. Curriculum'* plan developed by the Ministry of Education with a focus on developing the learners' core curriculum and cross-curricular competencies. Imagine the possibilities of moving from "what needs to be taught" to "engaging learners to learn". **Register by November 27, 2013 (4 pm) for grant assistance and December 20, 2013 without grant assistance.**

Program Details

Collaborative Projects: Projects involving multi-grades or cross-curricular classrooms only need to submit one application.

Program Advisor: Two one-hour consultation sessions will be conducted through skype/phone. We recommend scheduling the first session during the project planning stage and the second session shortly after the project starts. Teachers are requested to be flexible with scheduling time.

Art Integrated Inquiry: The artist-led sessions support the project unit of inquiry and should take place during school hours. The artist fee is set at \$1,200 including GST. The Vancouver Biennale will fund \$1,000 plus the \$200 school contribution. The applicant is responsible to raise funds for the school contribution plus any

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additional project expenses such as materials, equipment and field trip. The Artist fee will be payable upon project completion.

Subject Advisors: Contact subject specialists for consultation services and/or information sessions on the project's *Enduring Understanding* including topics such as current applications, practices, development and future trends.

Research Opportunity: Participating schools are invited to take part in an “artistic learning” research project headed by Professor Susan O’Neill, MODAL Research Group: www.modalresearch.com at Simon Fraser University’s Faculty of Education. The research itself will not take up much classroom time, and can work around the class schedule (e.g. three one-hour blocks of class time, spread out over the length of the BIG IDEAS project). This research will inform literature and documentation on student engagement and learning outcomes within the Arts, and will document the process and the value of collaborations between teachers, artists, students, parents and the community. Ethics approval and signed parental consent are required for all research participants.

Project Assistance: Applications without grant assistance will benefit from access to a program advisor, the project toolkit, our online learning resources, program workshops and e-newsletter.

Teacher/Artist Collaboration Grant

Apply for this grant if you intend to invite an artist to collaborate with you in class. Refer to the list of artists and workshop details at www.vancouverbiennale.com

- The Vancouver Biennale will fund \$1,000 towards the artist fee per class. The artist fee per class is set

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at \$1,200 **including GST** based on the established fee structure as per ArtStarts Artist in Residence guideline (\$65/hour of classroom time or \$250/day). Preparatory time outside the classroom is not billable.

- The applicant is responsible to raise funds for the balance of the artist fee (\$200) per class plus other expenses to complete the project such as equipment, materials, transportation for field trip and action plan implementation.
- All artist workshops are to take place while school is in session. Teachers are requested to be flexible with workshop scheduling time.
- Refer to the Vancouver Biennale education website for a list of BIG IDEAS artists. Teachers may propose other preferred artists (before application submission). Proposals will be reviewed by the Vancouver Biennale.
- The grant awarded will be paid directly to the artist in school team on behalf of the school, but not directly to the school.
