



Group to present findings on Pier 86 public art

The Friends of Art on Pier 86 group (FAP86) will present its feasibility study about public art on the Pier 86 structures on Wednesday, Jan. 20. The meeting will take place at the Port of Seattle building on Pier 69 (2711 Alaskan Way), from 7 to 9 p.m.

The keynote speaker for the meeting is Barrie Mowatt, founder and president of Vancouver Biennale. Mowatt, the curator of “the Giants” on the Granville Island silos, will discuss his group’s approaches and processes.

The FAP86 volunteers have spent a year studying the possibilities and receiving public input. They also conducted a survey that showed more than 60-percent support for moving forward.

With a small grant from the Seattle Department of Neighborhoods and cooperation of the Port of Seattle, FAP86 hired consultant Lesley Bain and her team from Framework.
